

## City of Killeen

WHEREAS in 1872, J. Sterling Morton proposed to the Nebraska Board of Agriculture that a special day be set aside for the planting of trees, and this holiday, called Arbor Day, was first

observed with the planting of more than a million trees in Nebraska; and

WHEREAS in 1889, the citizens of Temple, Texas authored an Arbor Day Resolution, which the Texas Legislature passed into law to encourage the planting of trees in the state; and

WHEREAS Arbor Day is now observed throughout the world and locally in Killeen; and

WHEREAS trees can reduce the erosion of valuable topsoil by wind and water, cut heating and cooling costs, moderate the temperature, clean the air, produce life-giving oxygen and provide

habitat for wildlife; and

WHEREAS trees are a renewable resource giving us paper, wood for our homes, fuel for our fires and

countless other products; and

WHEREAS trees in our city increase property values, enhance the economic vitality of business areas

and beautify our community; and

WHEREAS the City of Killeen has been designated an official Tree City USA since 2008 showing our

commitment to preserving and propagating trees in our community.

**NOW THEREFORE**, I, Jose L. Segarra, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the City of Killeen do hereby proclaim Friday, November 3, 2017 as:

Texas Arbor Day

and urge all residents of Killeen to become active in planting and protecting trees for the benefit of this and future generations.
